To which the sailor replied very faintly "Ce garde-marin le voit m'athafar (sic. attaquer?), et je ne cache rien à vous, pour l' empêcher" This same was not new to me, because I'd on much acc't to French men of war, but to find they it seemed past belief. And when we hoisted & ship'd the young muddy mauldrif'd it, exclaimed, "Darn 'em, it's no wonder we beat 'em."

The small dudley (the capt.) was a native of Boston, two or three yrs after I knew him he went from Br. America, brought his family to Boston & settled there. His daughter married Mr. Thos. C. Avery an old & intimate friend of mine.
