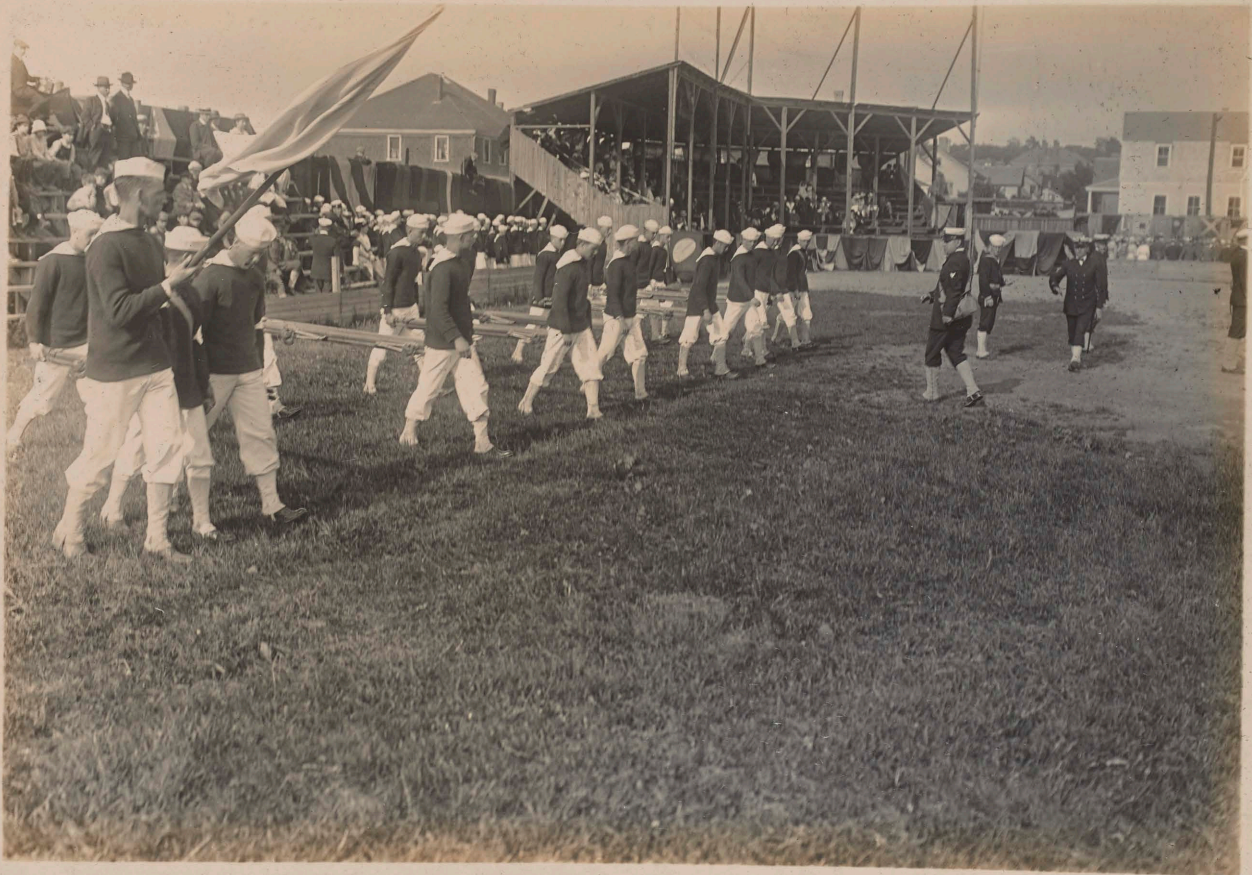


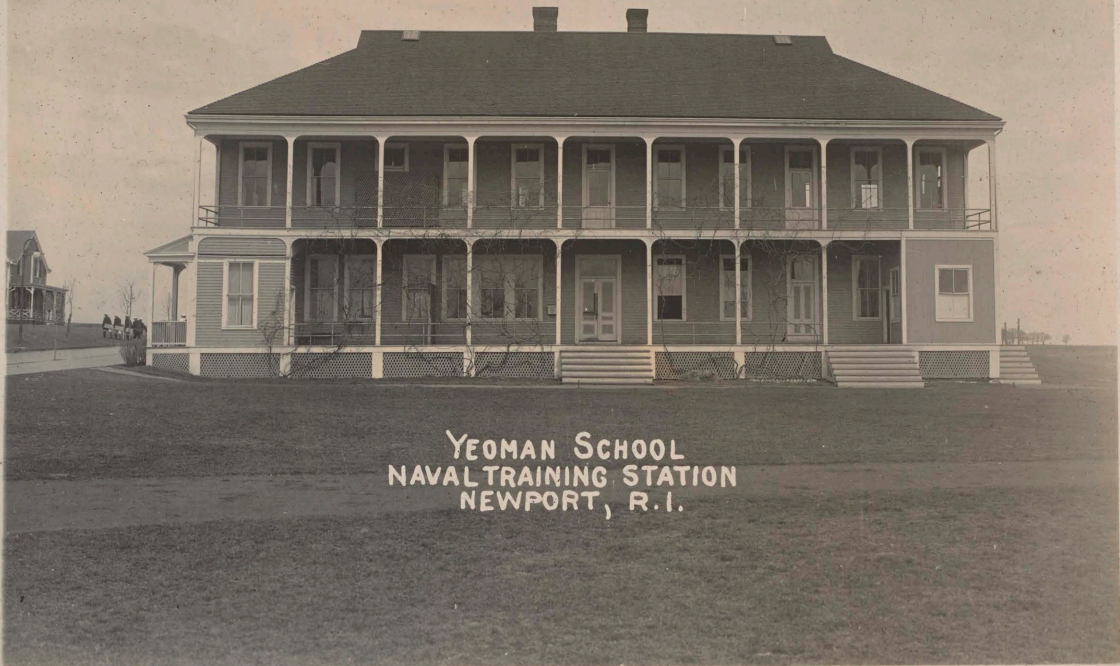
"U.S.S. CONSTELLATION"

DECEASED JANUARY 27, 1858.







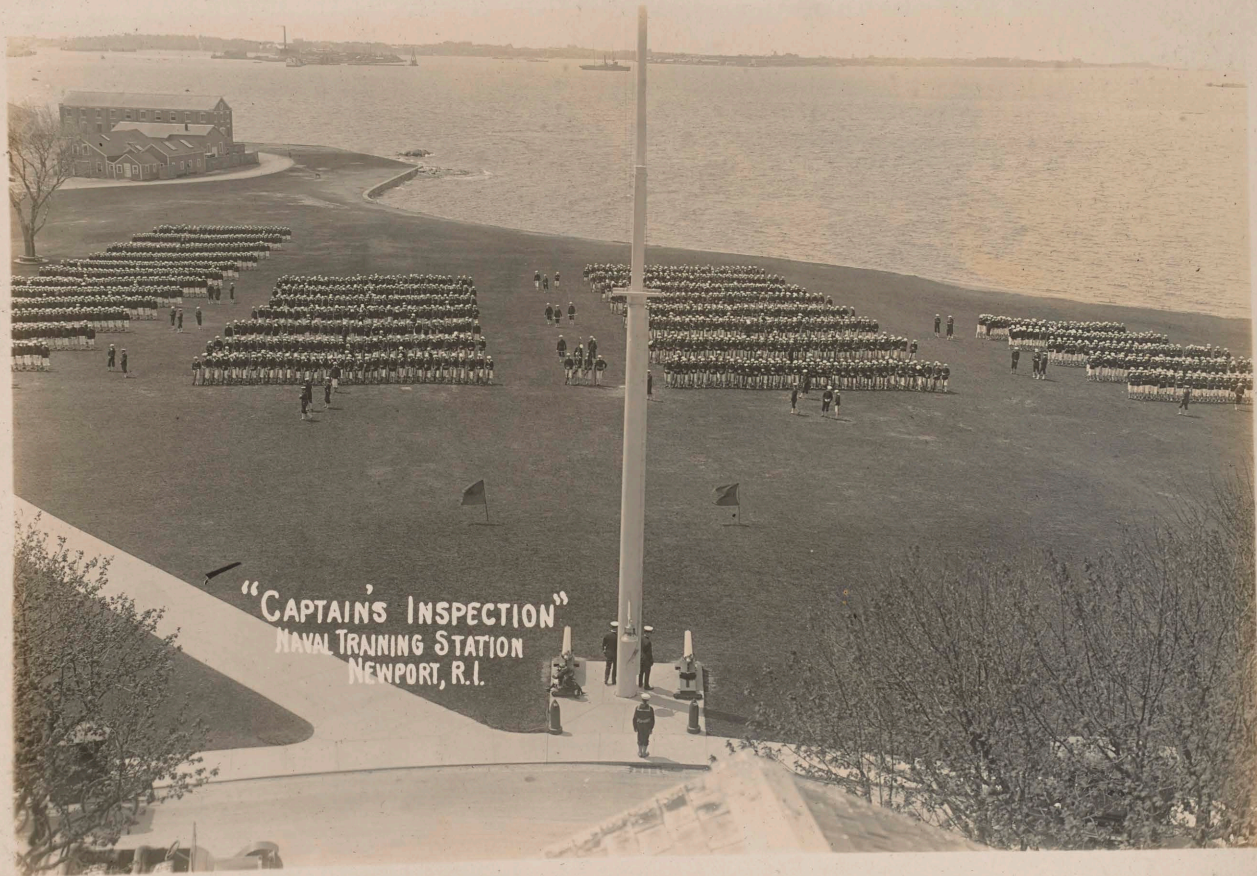

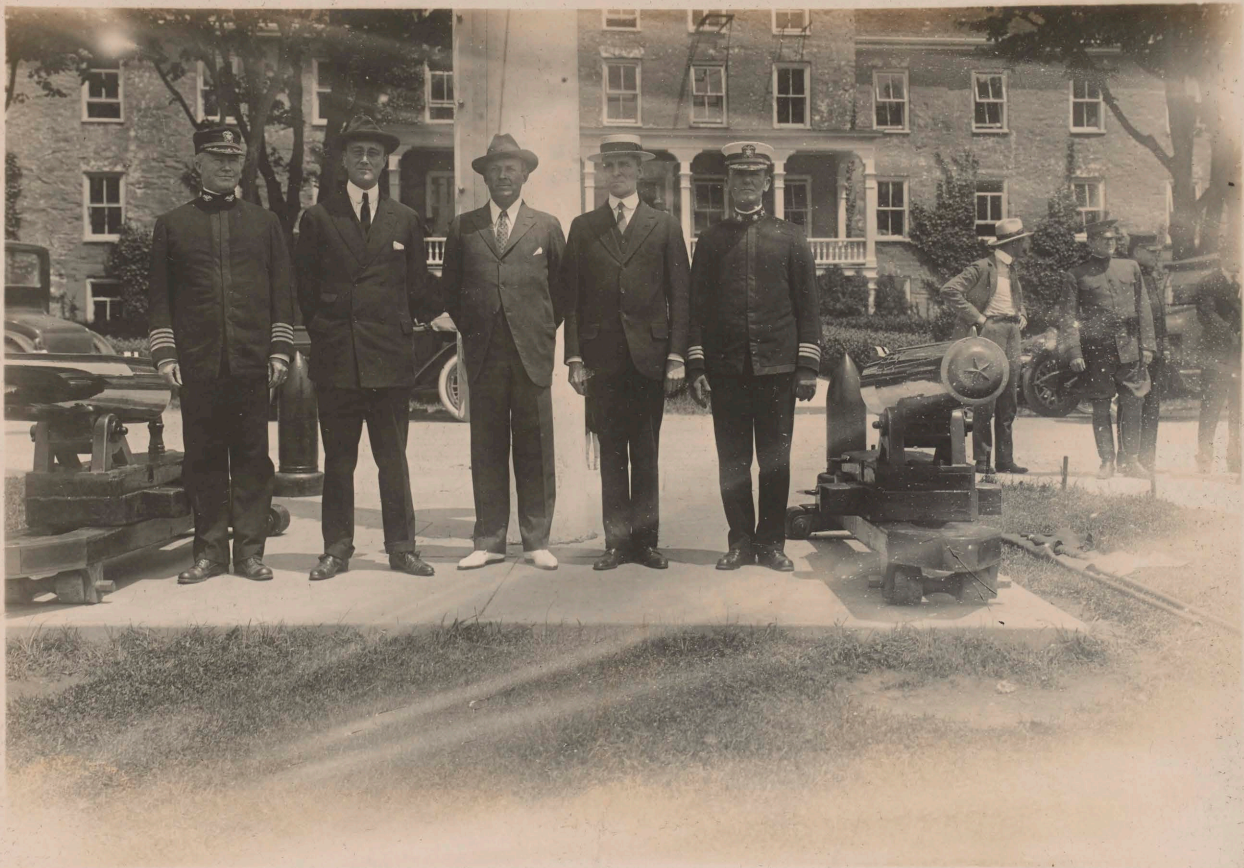


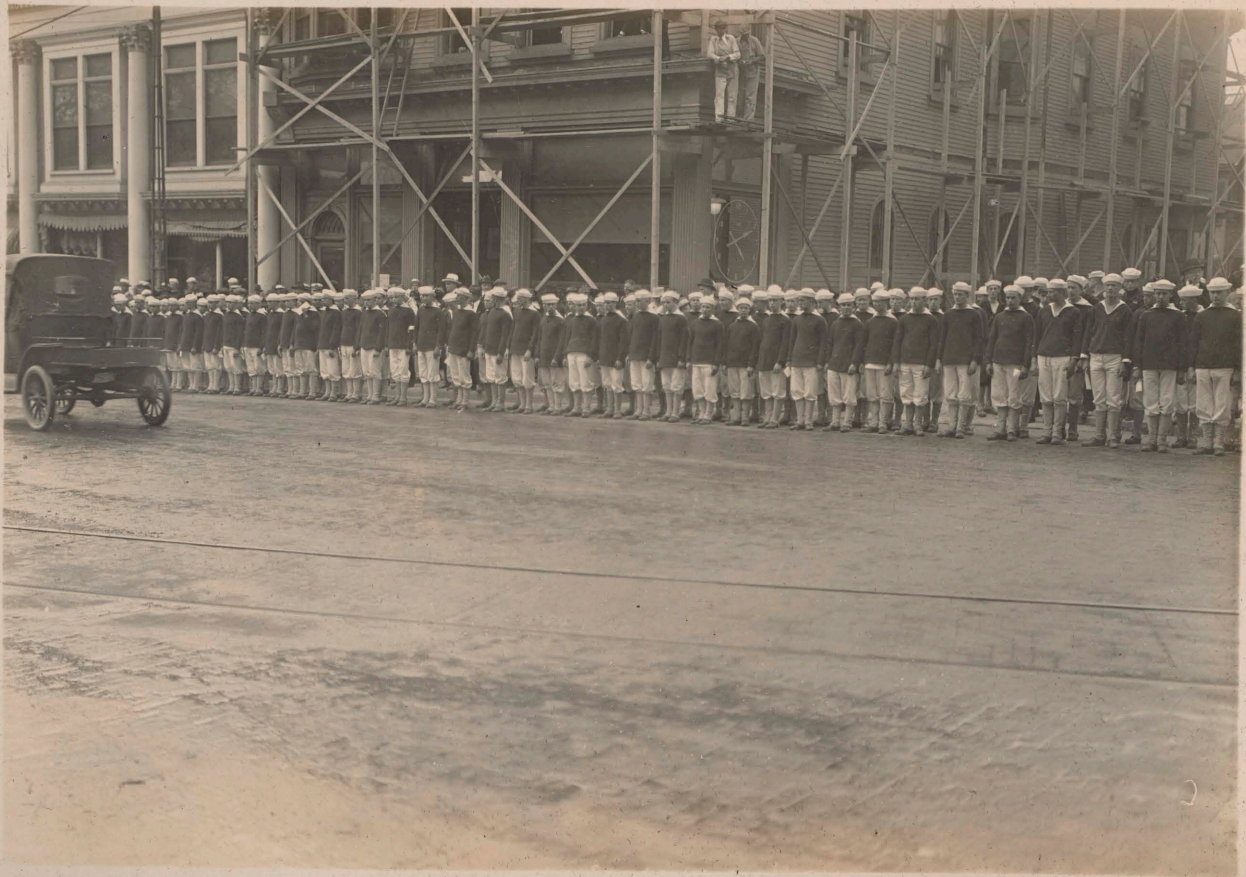
ARTILLERY DRILL (NORTH FIELD)

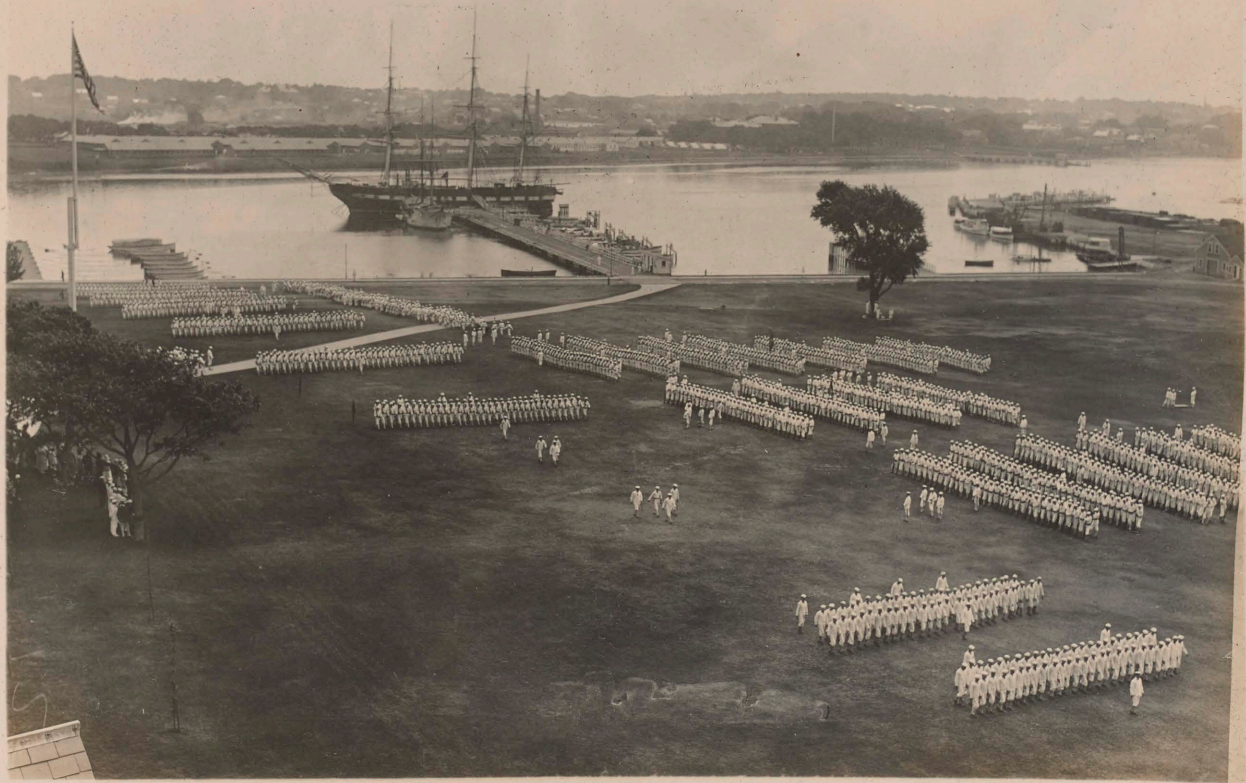


CHOW (DINNER) AT "A"

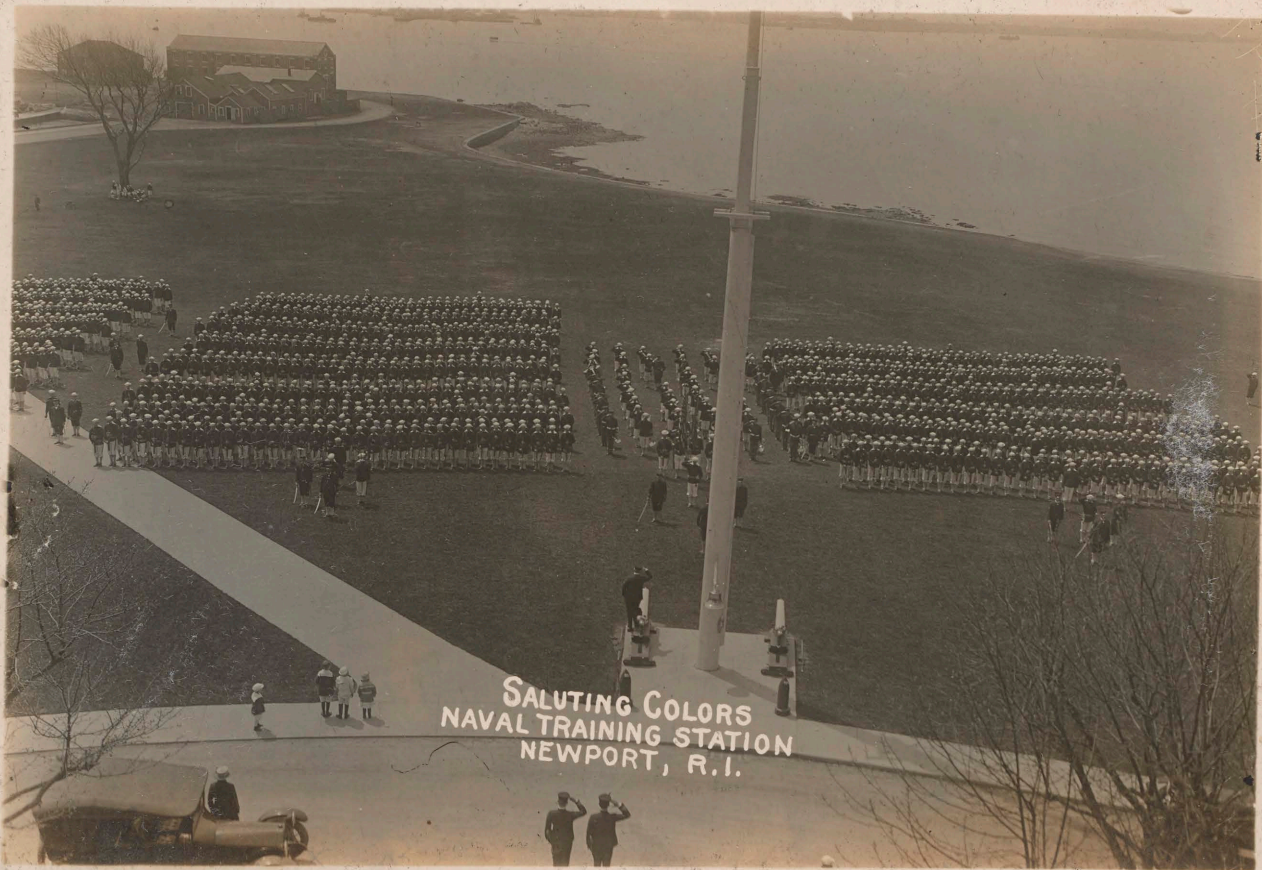




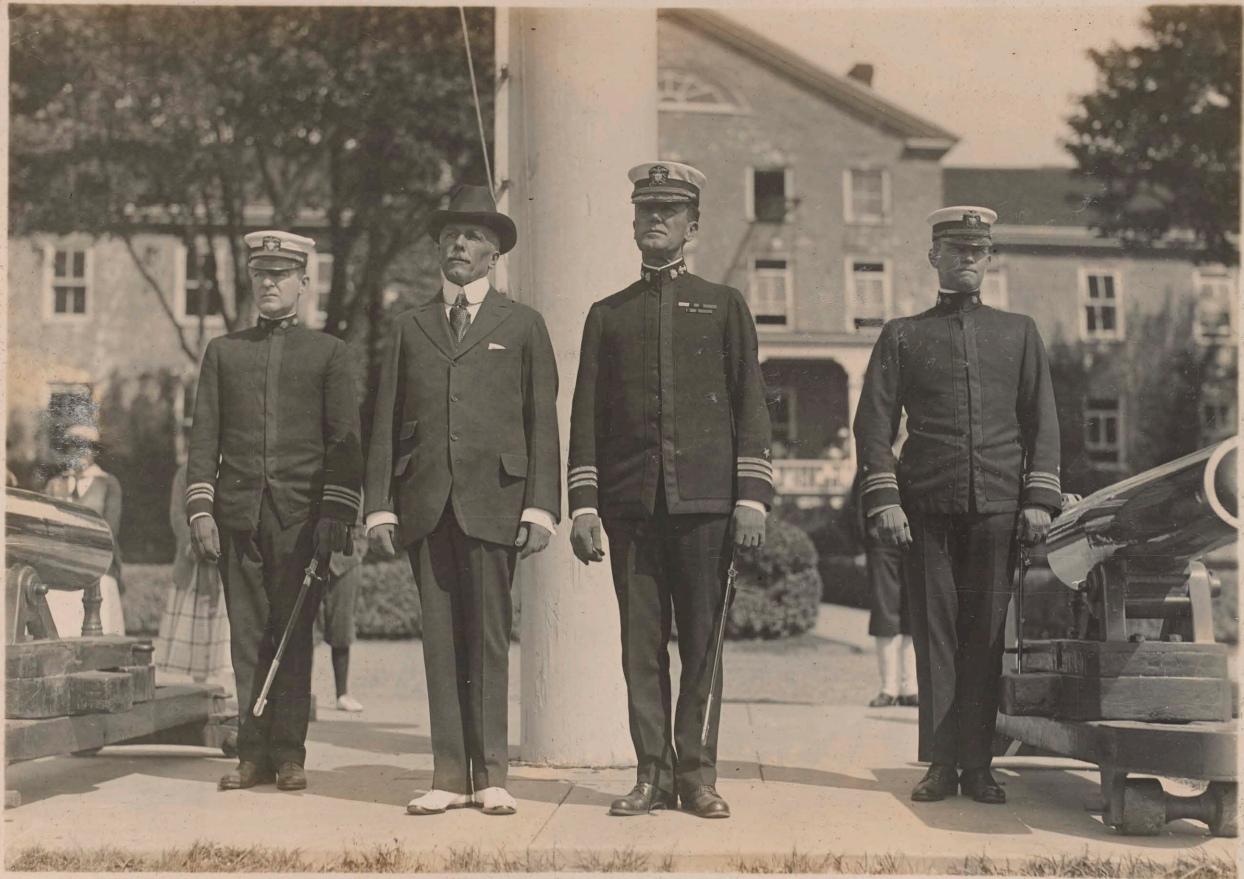
