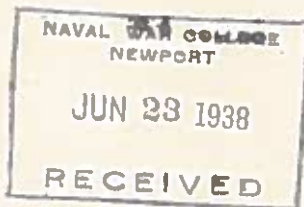

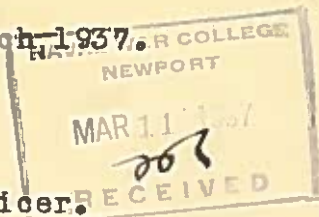

MEMORANDUM FOR CAPTAIN WILCOX

Dear Billy:

The following may be of interest to you in connection with the planting of gardens.

As to the flower beds around the house, Mrs. Cooke has written for seeds from one or two of the well known firms, the amount expended for this purpose being I believe about \$7.50. Tony, one of the War College attendants, plants these seeds in cold frames located next to your garden in the rear of the College, and when these seedlings are old enough they are transplanted to the beds around the house.

As to the vegetable garden back of the College, it has been customary to divide the land equally between the Chief of Staff and Secretary. Mr. Savage last year had a list of the amount of seeds that were purchased, and I am sure that you can get this information from him. Tony also plants this garden.

There is another garden located on Coddington Point, which I will be glad to show you, although Roberts also knows where it is. In this garden it has been customary to plant only potatoes and Golden Bantam or Country Gentleman corn. The necessary corn and fertilizer for the two gardens will cost you, I believe, approximately \$8, but I think that the expenditure of this amount is well justified.

If I can, I will try to locate an expense account which I remember making last year, that should be of help to you.

I gave Tony about \$5.00 for his trouble in planting the gardens. He was supposed to do this at such times as would not interfere with his other work.

3. The Public Works Officer's estimate for this work was \$275.00. In view of the excessive price of the low bid - \$352.00 - it is recommended that all bids be rejected and the work performed by station labor.
4. The certified check and bid bond received with bids have been retained in the Public Works Office until receipt of the Bureau's approval of the recommendation for carrying out this work.

My dear Himitz:

We are sending through the usual courses a requisition (Requisition No. 15-Navigation-1936) for painting the house of the Chief of Staff at the Naval War College. I would appreciate it very much if you can make this requisition your pet child while it is in the Bureau to see that it is approved and returned to us. My reason for thus bringing this particular requisition to your attention is that the Department of Public Works has estimated \$400 for doing this work. As you will see, a local contractor will do it for \$275. The Public Works Department states that it must be done by them at whatever cost they choose to charge. The matter, then, has come to an issue - who shall spend the War College appropriation, the War College authorities or the Public Works authorities.

Another point; the house in question badly needs painting for preservation. We haven't got \$400 in the allotment for those quarters but we have \$275, therefore are we to be bound so that Government property must depreciate simply because one department can not spend the moneys of another as uneconomically as they desire.

If you can help us out so that we win on this point, it will mean a big thing to the War College and the amount that we will be able to accomplish with the appropriation given to us.



Duncan, (CEC), U.S.N.

2. The Commanding Officer is without definite information regarding the officer complement of the Training Station in an inoperative status. Lieutenant James P. Bowles, (MC), U.S.Navy, has reported for duty, with additional duty in attendance upon officers and enlisted men and their families residing in Newport, R.I. Due to the fact that this

officer, in order to perform the duties required of him, should have Government transportation, and in view of the fact that if such Government transportation is not furnished, this Officer will have to furnish his own transportation, it is recommended that Quarters "K" be assigned to the Medical Officer. Except for the last occupant, these quarters have been occupied by the Medical Corps since they were built.

It is considered necessary that the Commissary Officer occupy quarters on the Station. Hence, it is recommended that the Commissary Officer occupy Quarters "D", as at present.


The Public Works Officer should have quarters on the Station and it is therefore recommended that Quarters "G", which have been occupied in times past by the Public Works Officer, remain as at present, assigned to the Public Works Officer.

The above designation of quarters, including, of course, the Commanding Officer in Quarters "A", covers all quarters which, in the opinion of the Commanding Officer, should be assigned to the officers of the Training Station in inoperative status.

The Commanding Officer is informed unofficially that Commander G. V. Stewart is soon to be detached, and the Commanding Officer has no information, official or unofficial, that any additional officers are to be ordered to the Station, and none are necessary. With Commander Stewart detached, the following quarters therefore are available for such designation as the Navy Department may direct: "C", "E", "F", "H", and "I".

3. In the assignment of Quarters "C", "E", "F", "H" and "I" the Commanding Officer recommends that "C", "E", and "G" be assigned to the War College for such designation as the President of the War College may direct.

It seems advisable that Quarters "F" and "I" be not assigned for occupancy at the present time. There is more or less work to be done on these quarters, which have been occupied for several years. Quarters "I" was struck by lightning last year. If these quarters remain unoccupied, the Commanding Officer can, from time to time, with great benefit to the Government, gradually place them in an excellent state of upkeep and preservation to the end that subsequent to 1 July 1922, they will be in fit condition to be turned over for such assignment as the Navy Department may direct.

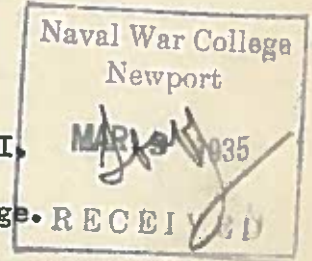

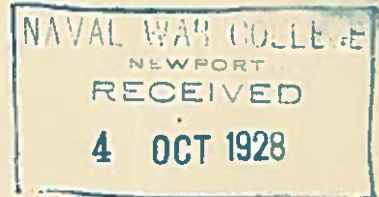

It will be noted from the reference, (inclosure A), that the Bureau of Navigation states it to be the understanding of that Bureau that the cost of maintenance of Quarters "I" is chargeable to the appropriation for the maintenance of the Naval War College, while they are occupied by an officer attached to the War College.

2. The exterior of Quarters "I" is in need of painting and should be painted this fall. It is requested that this work be authorized as a charge under War College funds in accordance with the inclosure.


1. Before assignment is made of the above mentioned quarters, the following work is desirable:
