BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH OF LECTURER

Hour Wednesday, 2 December 1953
1100 AIR OPERATIONS IN KOREA
 Major General Glenn O. Barcus, U.S. Air Force

General Barcus was born in Genoa, Illinois, on 25 July 1903. He attended the University of Illinois and received a B.S. Degree in 1924.

In 1925 he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Cavalry and after having served with the Field Artillery, he transferred to the Air Corps in 1926 and won his wings in 1927. His early duty was with Pursuit Groups at Randolph Field, Texas, at Hawaii's Schofield Barracks, at Langley Field, Virginia, and as instructor at Basic Flying School. In 1939 he graduated from the Air Corps Tactical School. After commanding squadrons at Langley and in Puerto Rico, and, following Pearl Harbor in Trinidad, in 1942 General Barcus was called to Army Air Corps Headquarters to be Deputy Director of Air Defense. He later commanded the Philadelphia Air Defense Wing, and then became Commanding General of the First Fighter Command in April 1943. Overseas in 1944 the General took command of the 64th Fighter Wing in Italy and later the 12th Tactical Command in France. After the war he first became Chief of Staff at Tactical Air Command, then headed the 12th Air Force. Prior to commanding TAC, an appointment he received in 1950, he headed the First Air Force. General Barcus was with TAC as Deputy Commander, when he was called to Korea, where he commanded the Fifth Air Force from 31 May 1952 to 31 May 1953. He is Vice Commander, Air Training Command, Scott Air Force Base, Illinois, at the present time.

After limited experience in flying jet planes (F-80's) in Europe, General Barcus checked out in F-86's in two hours' time. He flew more than a dozen missions in F-86's in Korea.

He holds the Distinguished Service Medal, for his part in the assault on the Siegfried Line, the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, and the Distinguished Flying Cross.
