## COMMITTEE STUDIES ------ FIRST PERIOD.

 17 December 1927 - 2 March 1928.The motive of the Committee Studies during the period 17 December, 1927, to $1^{1}$ irarch, 1928, is to encourage familiarity with antecedent naval history. The period to be studied is the 18th Century, which, in conjunction with the early part of the l9th Century, is generally conceded to have been the period during which sea power exerted its greatest influence upon earlier history.

The studies will be prepared with a view to their presentation to the assembled classes on dates to be assigned later. The presentations will take place as soon after $l$ March as possible, in any event not more than two weeks after that date, and will be in chronological order of subjects. The studies should be so drawn up as to require not more than two hours for their presentation. The time available for presentation prescribes this limit. Presentations of lesser length will bo entirely acceptable, provided tho subjects are fully coverod.

The prosontations should bc illustrated with slides, particularly slidcs of arcas involved, reproduction of prints and paintings, ete. For the purpose of preparing such slides, the services of the draftsmen and photographers are available to Committee Chairmen, the priority being in the order of Committee numbering. In all probability, certain slides of geographical areas will serve for more than one Committee. About 20 pages of double-spaced type-written matter, with slides, can be presented in one hour.

Studies should, in all cases, include the political background as it existed at the beginning of the period under study. Later political changes, and their bearing upon subsequent
naval strategy, should be mentioned where necessary. contemporaneous land operations should bo includcd only if they have dircet bearing upon operations at sca, or indirectly because of political changes. No details of land operations should be included.

The studies should be in narrative form. Outstanding attributes and characteristics of leaders should be included. No particular stress need be laid upon tactical maneuvers after action has been joined, unless essential to complete understanding. Descriptions of sea battles should be confined to the "high lights" of the battles and their results from both a military and political standpoint. It is believed that Coramittees will instantly perceive what to include, and the number and character of studies required in order to bring about a clear picture of such battles.

The outline, and considerable detail, of the subjectmatter of the Committee Studies will be found in Mahan's "Influence of Sea Power upon History, 1660-1783," and "The Influence of Sea Power upon the French Revolution and Empire," by the same author. It is not expected that Committees shall adhere strictly to the se two works but, rather, that they shall consult other works in order to produce well rounded and interesting narratives.

Since the several completed studies are to form one Complete Chronological study, Chairmen will coordinate their efforts to tho extent of seuing that their studios dovetail with the preceding and succeeding subjects.
