MEMORANDUM.

To: Chief of Naval Operations. From: Captain J. S. McKean, U. S. N.

Subject :- Mobilization Plans.

1. There are submitted herewith for your consideration tentative Mobilization Plans as of the dates of July 1, 1916, July 1, 1920, July 1, 1924 (the completion and commissioning of the last of the five-year building program proposed in the present estimates).

2. "The Fleet" is organized on the following system:

(a) <u>Battleships</u> and <u>Cruisers</u> organized in Divisions of 3 ships each; Squadrons of 3 Divisions each;
Fleets (or Naval Corps; there is no title in our official language that covers this) of 3 Squadrons each.

The <u>tactical unit</u> in each case is the <u>Division</u>. The <u>administrative</u> <u>unit</u> is the <u>Squadron</u>.

(b) The <u>Destroyer Flotilla</u> is divided into 3 Squadrons of 3 Groups each, with 6 vessels in each Group.

The <u>tactical unit</u> being the <u>Group</u>. The administrative unit, the Squadron.

- (c) The <u>Submarines</u> (Coast Defense Type) are ultimately to be grouped in Divisions of 10, each Division based on a Submarine Shore Base.
- (d) The <u>Train</u> is divided into 3 Groups corresponding to the three Battleship Squadrons, so that should a Squadron with its corresponding Scouts, Cruisers, Destroyers, etc., be sent on detached duty away from Flag of Commander in Chief, it would be accompanied by a proper train.
- (c) The <u>Naval Districts</u> are organized in general along the lines recommended by the Board on that question, using the old Battleships no longer available for the Battle Line as Flagships.
- (f) The <u>Advance Base Force</u> is that provided at present (2 Regiments of Marines) and as vessels become available an Advance Base Guard, which would also serve as a First Reserve for the Fleet is organized and based on the Advance Base.

3. The Command Organization is an attempt to establish a real military flow of authority and to proportion military rank to military responsibility - the general scheme being to have a certain rank for each definite function and thus to bring military organization into agreement with functional management.

The Fleet Organization consists of

1.	The	Fleet	commanded	by an	Admiral.
2.	The	Battleship Fleets	Ħ	11	Vice Admirals.
3.	The	Squadrons	11	Ħ	Rear Admirals.
4.	The	Divisions	Ħ	Ħ	Commodores.

4. The total of Flag Officers - 65 in 1916, 71 in 1920, 74 in 1924 - seems in comparison with our present allowance very excessive, but it is believed that to give our fleet a proper military organization, which will be capable of handling it <u>of</u>-<u>ficiently</u> in war, or to properly prepare in peace for its use in war, will require not less than this number of officers and that we today have in Flag grades and the grade of Captain, ample officers of over 30 years' commissioned service to permit of the immediate increase to the above numbers; and that their promotion with the promotions in the lower grades following therefrom would relieve the most serious stagnation now affecting the Line of the Navy. Length of service in lower grades combined with increased numbers entering at the Naval Academy would very rapidly cure all the other ills and cure them permanently.

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5. The increased cost of the above increased number of Flag Officers would not exceed \$150,000 annually, which is about 1/3 of 1% of the total Pay of the Navy and is less than 1/10 of 1% of the annual appropriation for the present year.

6. The Efficiency of our Fleet in War ultimately depends on the <u>sufficiency</u> and <u>efficiency</u> of the Command Organization and the <u>total cost</u> of <u>the above</u> seems to me a <u>very</u>, <u>very</u> small cost for the efficient supervision of a Fleet costing at least \$1,000,000,000.00 and having on board in 1924 about 100,000 officers and men.
