Subject: Umpire Reports -- Positions of Units during Grand Joint Exercise Number 4 and Fleet Problem XIII.

Reference: (a) U. S. Fleet Umpire Instructions 1931.

(b) Regulations for Joint Army and Navy Exercises — prepared by Joint Board, August 15, 1924.

Enclosure: (A) Tables I, II, III, IV, V and VI for BLUE Umpires, Grand Joint Exercise Number 4.

(B) Tables I, II, III, IV, V and VI for BLUE Umpires, Fleet Problem XIII.

1. The following system is furnished for reporting to Fleet Umpire and Chief Umpire, position of own forces when not in the presence of enemy forces. This system shall not be disclosed to anyone except umpires. Umpires shall prepare personally all messages for transmission when using this system and decode all messages received in this system.

- 2. To report the position of a unit, six groups of letters are employed, as follows:
  - (a) First group indicates unit or officer reported—by substituting letters for figures in the secret radio call sign of the unit (or officer) reported. Use Table I.
  - (b) Second group. The first letter indicates a geographical point; the second and third letters together indicate the hour, expressed in two figures. Use Table II.
  - (c) Third group indicates distance (miles) in three figures from point indicated. Use Table III.
  - (d) Fourth group indicates true bearing (degrees) in three figures from point indicated.

In case the position reported coincides with a point, the third group (distance) is "zero zero" and the fourth group (bearing) may be any three letters. Use Table IV.

(e) Fifth group indicates true course (degrees) in three figures. Use Table V.

(f) Sixth group indicates speed (knots) in three figures (the first of which will be zero). Use Table VI.

(g) In case there is no data for fifth (or sixth) group, fill in space with any letter used three times. For example, if information about speed is unknown, the sixth group might be "XXX" or "AAA" or "FFF," etc.

h) Attention is invited especially to page 7 of reference (a) relative to Umpire communications.

3. One unit will be reported by each six consecutive groups, but two or more unit reports may be combined in one message.

**EXAMPLE:** Crudiv two (secret radio call assumed to be W43) at 10 hours zone plus eight is 100 miles, and bears 100° true from Point C. Speed 15 knots and course 100° true. This information encoded is assumed to be "WGA CPA COZ CTJ COJ JWQ"

Batdiv One (secret radio call assumed to be X32) at 10 hours zone plus eight is 1 mile, and bears 0° true from Point D. Speed 12 knots and course 90° true. This information encoded is assumed to be "XVP DQA JTC JOJ ARJ JWL."

The Fleet Umpire, after noting contents of each, combines these two reports in one message for the Chief Umpire as follows:

- 4. Examples and necessary additional instructions are included in Tables I, II, III, IV, V and VI. These sets of tables are each intended for use during only one exercise or problem.
- 5. I desire a copy of this letter (with the proper enclosure) to be delivered by Commander Battle Force to each BLUE Ship Umpire and Unit Umpire, and to the Fleet Umpire for Grand Joint Exercise Number 4 and for Fleet Problem XIII. Copies to these Umpires should be in individual sealed envelopes marked "Confidential to be opened by BLUE Ship Umpire, Unit Umpire, or Fleet Umpire, and by no one else."
