

## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. A Seapower Symposium Duty Officer will be available at all times in the Symposium Duty Office at the Naval War College (Pringle Hall). The Duty Office telephones are 841-3550 and 841-3650. In addition, a Duty Office is established in the Treadway Inn in Room 102. The Treadway Inn Duty Officer can be contacted on room telephones by dialing "102" if you are at the Inn, or by dialing 847-4977 if calling from outside. The Treadway Inn switchboard number is 847-9000.
2. For your convenience, a Hospitality Room has been established on the fourth floor of the Treadway Inn, Rooms 432/433. The Hospitality Room will open in the afternoons as indicated in the Schedule of Events, and will close at 0100. Note, however, that on Sunday, 31 October, the Hospitality Room will be located on the ground floor in the Treadway Inn Marine Suite. Newly arrived guests are invited to use this larger room as a center for meeting one another during the evening.
3. You may telephone anyone at the Inn from your room telephone by dialing the room number.
4. One sedan is provided for each country and will be dispatched to meet the schedule of events. Special transportation requirements can be arranged through your escort officer or through the Symposium Transportation Dispatcher in the Symposium Duty Office at the War College. The Dispatcher's number is 841-3950.
5. Breakfast for Seapower Symposium attendees will be served in the hotel dining room (Blue Porpoise Restaurant) commencing at 0700 each morning.

## COMMUNICATIONS PLAN

1. General. Communications facilities for guests are available at the Naval Communication Station Newport located in Building 87/87A twenty-four (24) hours a day for the duration of the visit. Messages received by the Naval Communication Station Newport of priority or higher precedence will be passed to the recipient as soon as received. Routine precedence messages received after normal working hours will be held until the following morning for pick-up by the appropriate escort officer. The Communication Station has covered point-to-point teletype circuits with various commands who are capable of interfacing with Allied Commands. Naval Communication Station Newport does not hold any National Crypto Systems.

2. The following communications arrangements have been established to ensure timely delivery of incoming and outgoing messages which have either been addressed to or originated by a guest.

a. Incoming Messages

(1) In order to ensure the most expeditious handling of incoming messages, they should be routed through the country's embassy, Washington, D.C., to the Naval War College, Newport, with internal passing instructions.

(2) Three copies of all incoming messages will be provided to the addressee.

(3) During working hours, while the guest is at the Naval War College, the Naval Communication Station Watch Officer will notify the Symposium Duty Officer that message traffic has been received at the Communication Station and is awaiting pick-up. The Symposium Duty Officer will inform the appropriate escort officer who will pick up the messages at the pick-up window of Building 87A.



(4) During non-working hours, messages received at the Communication Station of a priority or above precedence will be delivered by the Naval Communication Station messenger. The Naval Communication Station Watch Officer will contact the Symposium Duty Officer who will advise as to the location and appropriate escort officer to which the message will be delivered. The motor pool will provide a driver and vehicle for the Communication Station messenger.

b. Outgoing Messages

(1) During normal working hours at the Naval War College, if any guest desires to originate a message, he may give it to the assigned escort officer to be delivered to the Communication Station Watch Officer in Building 87A for transmission. The Communication Station will transmit the message and will provide the originator with three copies.

(2) During non-working hours, the rough draft should be delivered by the assigned escort officer to the Communication Station Duty Officer in Building 87A for transmission.

(3) Outgoing messages shall be addressed as follows:

## PUBLICITY AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS

During the Symposium the Naval War College will be issuing news releases to representatives of the local news media. To support the releases and also provide photographs for the post-Symposium summary of proceedings, Navy photographers will be covering all Symposium events.

It is anticipated that requests will be received from local media for interviews with certain participants. Accordingly, all requests will be coordinated with the Escort Officer to determine the attendees' personal preferences. Any requests for anonymity will be fully respected.

Any guest who desires to be interviewed should notify his Escort Officer. On the other hand, any guest who does not want his name or photograph released should also mention this to his Escort Officer.

## MEDICAL PLAN

Naval Hospital Newport will have ambulance service with a physician available on call on a twenty-four hour basis, telephone 841-3771, for the entire Symposium period. The ambulance is fully equipped with emergency medical supplies.

The hospital is a fully accredited general hospital with a well-qualified staff representing most medical and surgical specialities. The full staff is on board from 0800-1630 daily during the Symposium. Watch standers include four medical officers from 1630 to 0800 the following morning.

A medical kit will be provided the Duty Officer at the Treadway Motor Inn. Drugs provided will consist of aspirin, cold pills, diarrhea mixture, band aids, cough mixture, throat lozenges, etc. This kit will be in the Duty Officer's custody and will contain full instructions for proper administration of all medications included. All other medical emergencies should be referred to the Naval Hospital.
