3. All expenses incurred under these orders, including travel, will be borne by the Federal Republic of Germany Government.

4. In accepting this authorization you are informed that the Government of the United States does not accept any blame, or financial responsibility for injuries received by you while in the United States, or responsibility for personal or property damage claims resulting from your actions. Also that it will be your responsibility that the United States customs, health and passport requirements are fulfilled. Dependents will not be transported nor maintained at the expense of the United States Government.


5. Upon completion of this training, you will be detached in order that you may proceed as directed by your government.




